The 'stickybeak God'

I would like to call into question the imagine of God as a 'stickybeak'. We all grew up with this idea, more or less:

There is a penthouse in heaven with a 'space' view; an old man, with a long and white beard, lives there. As he never dies, he must be extremely bored. Consequently, he deeply enjoys watching you, especially the bad things you do. You go out, and he is watching you; you come back into the house, and he is watching you, you go to the living room, and he is watching you; you go to the bedroom and - of course - he is watching you.

God the big watcher...

Simply put, the creator of Heaven and Earth, the foundation of everything, he who is infinite in space and time, the all-powerful, the all-knowing, this God is very much interested in 'how much pavlova you had last night'!

I believe, instead, in a God who trusts our reason, namely, our ability to discern between things that bring us closer to the fullness of life and things that bring us closer to death.

I believe this because of Paul's connection between sin and death. According to the second reading, sin brings death in our lives.

In fact, we designate the things that bring us closer to death as sins. Thus, I would dare to say that sin is essentially a kind of spiritual homicide. We should question ourselves frequently: which of my relationships is dying because of this action, choice, or habit: my relationship with myself? Others? God?

Therefore, this action or choice is a sin not only because the priest, your mum, your teacher said that it is, but precisely because it leads you to a kind of death.

Accordingly, this line of thought, you may discover sins that you would not have thought of as a such. Exhausting work for the good of business, for example, can be a sin, to the extent that it kills yourself and your relationship with friends and family.

I want to be brutally honest with you:

I truly find it difficult to claim that God is very much perturbed by our sins. We should be perturbed!

The reason why we go for confession to another human being is precisely because sin is against a creature.

The reason why we say 'Lord have mercy' is precisely because sin is an attempt to destroy his creation.

Hence, the Church is not obsessed with your sins, it is obsessed with your life because 'sin is the sting of death'.
