Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,
There is a trend in the gospel readings after the events of the resurrection.
This trend is Jesus's teaching on how intimate he can be with us now.
Last Sunday, we experienced that Jesus is the Good Shepherd who leads us to heaven.
Sometimes he has to go looking for us when we stray from the flock and when he finds us, he happily puts us on his
shoulder, carrying us back to the flock.

This Sunday, Jesus tells us he is the vine and we are the branches.
It is such a profound and beautiful image of our life with Jesus. The vine and the branches are distinct yet becomes
one in the plant, to bear fruit. The function and goal of a vine is to bear the branches which bear the fruit. The vine
needs the branches to bear fruit and supplies the branches, with all the nutrients to keep it alive and bear fruit.

How do we stay connected to the vine? To not sin.
If we do, we must come back to God by the sacrament of reconciliation, follow God's commandments, listen to
God's word and put it into practice. We must receive the Lord in the Eucharist by coming to Mass each week,
love God and other people, be kind and compassionate and stay in a state of grace always, because we do not
know the hour God will come in glory to take us to be with him.

"Cut off from me you can do nothing." Jesus means 'nothing' good in the sense, it does not add anything to our
eternal life. We may be able to achieve great things according to worldly standards and success, but not in the eyes
of God.

What is the fruits that Jesus is talking about?
He is talking about the fruit of love, peace, joy, reconciliation with God and each other, friendship, holiness, virtue
and compassion. The Holy Spirit, who we profess as The Lord, the giver of life comes to us, remains with us and
gives us what we want and need to be faithful to Jesus and to bear fruit.

Are you bearing fruit? The fruit that God wants?
Let us bear fruit so that we know we are in the Lord, living the life that pleases God and worthy for eternal life.
God takes our life seriously and expects us to bear fruit. If God doesn't expect fruit from us, then God does not take
our life very seriously, since He doesn't care what our life becomes.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

'MAKE YOUR HOME IN ME'

The juxtaposition of the story of Saul
(Paul) in the first reading from Acts
with the image of Jesus as the vine in
the Gospel speaks to the formation of
disciples of Jesus. In Acts we have a
glimpse into the beginnings of Saul's (not
yet called Paul) ministry who, with all the
zeal of his experience of the risen Christ,
joins the believers. Barnabus takes him
under his wing. Trouble erupts with the
Hellenists and Paul is whisked away from
Jerusalem to his hometown to where he
contemplates his call.

When we then hear the Gospel's
beautifully elegant description of the vine
and the branches we can connect with the
formation of the disciples and discern our
own call. The clear instruction is 'to make
your home in me', to make our home in
Jesus. It is a symbiotic relationship just
like the vine and its branches. We need
to remain/abide in Jesus to bear fruit.
No matter our zeal, our life of faith and
ministry grows and flows from Jesus.
This is further enriched by the words of
the second reading from the First Letter
of John where we hear that 'our love is
not to be just words or mere talk but
something real and active'. We are to live
the life God wants, to love one another
and live in God.

Vines and their fruit are no stranger to
us here in Australia, so we take time to
reflect on this image to see how closely we
abide in Jesus the vine.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

of him: they could not believe he was really
a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge
of him, introduced him to the apostles, and
explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul

he had preached boldly at Damascus in the
name of Jesus. Saul now started to go round
with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly
in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken
